In addition, UCP provides a wide variety of programs that focus on activities of daily living, verbal and non-verbal communication and community integration and awareness. Programs include Saddle Pals therapeutic horseback riding, UCP's Autism Center for Excellence at Sacramento State, adult day programs, independent living services and in-home respite care for families.

Heather represents employers and management in labor and employment matters, including civil litigation in state and federal courts. She is involved in several local and state organizations. Heather holds a bachelor's degree from San Francisco State University and graduated with honors from the University of the Pacific McGeorge School of Law.
