The ACE program provides opportunities to work on socialization skills, build friendships, learn team work and increase appropriate behaviors in a 1 to 3 staffing ratio. At the end of the year the participants are able to take their newly acquired skills to ACE

#### Carbon Monoxide Poisoning:

# **Carbon Monoxide Poisoning**

According to the CDC, "the first month of the year is the worst for carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning". At least 2 people die each day from CO poisoning in January as a result from working with tors on every level of your home. fuel burning furnace, vehicle, generator, • arill. or elsewhere.

Carbon monoxide, an odorless, colorless gas, which can cause sudden illness and death, is produced any time a fossil fuel is burned. CO from these sources can build up in enclosed or semi-enclosed spaces and poison the people and animals in them. Carbon Monoxide is referred to as the "silent killer" because most victims do not smell, hear, taste, see or feel carbon monoxide. Common symptoms include headaches, nausea, dizziness, or confusion.

- Have your heating system, water heater and any other gas, oil or coalburning appliance inspected and serviced by a qualified technician every vear.
- Install battery-operated CO detec-
- Don't use a generator, charcoal grill, camp stove or other gasoline or charcoal-burning device inside the home, basement or garage or outside the home near a window.
- Don't burn anything in an unvented stove or fireplace.
- Don't let a vehicle idle inside a garage attached to a house, even if the garage door is left open.
- ◆Don't heat a house with a gas oven.
