Program Spotlight By: Eric Ciampa

Sunday October 22 will go down in UCP history as one of our proudest moments.

Hundreds of individuals have been impacted by the Santa Rosa fires, including clients of UCP. On October 9, 240 clients residing at Sonoma Developmental Center (a state-run institution for clients with severe developmental disabilities) were evacuated by the Office of Emergency Services to Dixon fairgrounds.

At 6pm on Saturday October 21, UCP received an urgent request from California Department of Developmental Services and the Office of Emergency Services to aid in the transportation of clients and staff back to Sonoma Developmental Center.

Before sunrise, UCP drivers woke up ready to take 17 UCP buses to Dixon. UCP took the lead as the primary agency responsible for transporting nearly all non-ambulatory residents. By Sunday evening, UCP vehicles made 20 trips and drove over 3,200 miles to take 141 clients and staff back home.

We are extremely proud of our staff! It was an AMAZING day. I could not be more proud of our staff that day.

YAY, November is finally here! That means that Thanksgiving is just right around the corner. For many of us, Thanksgiving will be a joyful day spending quality time with our loved ones and get to reunite with family members that we may not have seen for awhile. For many others it might be a somewhat hectic, but still an exciting day, as they will organize and prepare a huge family feast. Nevertheless, Thanksgiving should be a day filled with joy and happiness, therefore, the American Red Cross offers some cooking safety tips, so you can enjoy quality time with your loved ones and keep you and your family safe.

Follow these safe cooking practices:

- When cooking your Thanksgiving food, check it regularly, especially the turkey.
- ARC discourages the use of turkey fryers at home.
- Use a timer as a reminder that the stove or oven is on.
- Keep children and pets away from the cooking area.
- Keep anything that can catch on fire such as pot holders, oven mitts, wooden utensils, etc. away from the stove, oven or any other appliance in the kitchen that generates heat.
- Clean cooking surfaces on a regular basis to prevent grease buildup.
- Consider purchasing a fire extinguisher and keep it in the kitchen.
